Scope of Work:

The project involves restoring Keegan Bayou, which is located on the south side of the Back Bay of Biloxi at the I-110 Corridor in the City of Biloxi. Restoration activities include removing marine debris, accumulated sediment, and invasive/non-native plant species, and re-establishing appropriate marsh plants to slow down and disperse road runoff and stormwater that is discharged directly into the bayou.

Following restoration activities, public access improvements will be installed that include an environmentally sensitive nature trail/boardwalk enhanced with educational signage to improve public awareness about the benefits of tidelands/wetlands conservation in terms of storm mitigation, flood prevention and ecosystem preservation.
